**TO ALL BRITISH COLUMBIA LAND SURVEYORS**

**Re: Requests for Proposal for the Survey of Certain Nisga'a Lands**

Upon the effective date of the Nisga'a Final Agreement, certain Indian Reserves, some additions to Indian Reserves and certain unsurveyed portions of provincial Crown land, outside of the Nisga'a Settlement Lands are to be vested in the Nisga'a Tribal Council by provincial statute. These lands are referred to as Category A and Category B Lands.

In preparation for the transfer of these lands, the Office of the Surveyor General is seeking Requests for Proposal for the survey of eight Category A or Category B sites.
