CIRCULAR LETTER TO ALL BRITISH COLUMBIA LAND SURVEYORS

Sir:

Re: Tape Standardization Base
City of North Vancouver.

This is to advise that a three-hundred-foot tape standardization base was established by the Surveys and Mapping Branch of the Department of Lands, Forests and Water Resources in the City of North Vancouver in September 1968 and is now available for use by B. C. Land Surveyors and others.

The base is marked by four brass plugs numbered 1, 2, 3 and 4. The distances tabulated below refer to the distances between points which are marked by a drill hole in the surface of each brass plug. The plugs are numbered from north to south and the northerlymost plug, (No. 1), is located on the sidewalk on the west side of Jones Avenue, on the extension of a line defined by the northern edge of the sidewalk on the north side of 18th street.

Base Values - September 1968.

Plug 1 - 2	100.001'
Plug 2 - 3	100.001'
Plug 3 - 4	100.002'
