CIRCULAR LETTER TO ALL BRITISH COLUMBIA LAND SURVEYORS

Dear Sir:

Re: Tape and E. D. M. Standardization Base at Prince George.

A one hundred metre chainage base was established in the City of Prince George in October of 1974.

The base is marked by five aluminum plugs set in the sidewalk on the south side of Fifth Avenue between Victoria Street and Vancouver Street. Plug No. 1 is at the east end of the base.

Base values - October 1974:

Plug 1 - 2 - 25.00 metres

Plug 2 - 3 - 25.000 metres

Plug 3 - 4 - 24.999 metres

Plug 4 - 5 - 24.999 metres

As an additional convenience for checking E.D.M. equipment, an additional plug (No. 6) was placed westerly from Plug 5 at the south-east corner of Fifth Avenue and Winnipeg Street. The horizontal distance between Plug 5 and Plug 6 is 261.864 metres.

The plug elevations are: #1 - 0.00 metres

#2 - 0.52 metres

#3 - 0.95 metres

#4 - 1.41 metres

#5 - 1.76 metres

#6 - 4.75 metres

Elevations are based on an assumed elevation of $0.00\ \mathrm{metres}$ for Plug No. 1.
